

GAC Employees Obtain Certificates In Etiquette Training



Over four hundred employees of the Country's Supreme Audit Institution, the General Auditing Commission (GAC), have completed a week long training course in Etiquette and Ethics.

The training, which ran from 13th to 17th April, 2015, was conducted by the Liberia Institute of Protocol and Etiquette headed by Rev. Dr. J. Adolphus During former Liberia Chief of Protocol of the Republic of Liberia.

The drill sought to educate employees of the Commission on the necessary protocol and etiquette standards when it comes to interacting with their fellow workmates and with clients.

Topics highlighted during the exercise included Introduction to Etiquette, Ethics and Image Management and Dress code. Each participant at the end of the Course took an aptitude test to help evaluate their level of participation and comprehension during the five-day exercise.

The program, which was funded by the Commission's international partners including the Integrated Public Financial Management Reform Project (IPFMRP) and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), also sought to improve the quality of services provided by employees of the Commission.

Speaking at the close of the interactive forum, Auditor General (AG) Yusador Gaye described the exercise as rewarding and called on employees to put into practice what they have learned.

According to AG Gaye, the training will also afford her employees the opportunity to develop a new sense of direction in managing issues relating to their co-workers and the institutions they audit. This, she said, must be carried out in a more proficient way that will yield what she called the yearning outcome.

Auditor General Gaye had earlier announced plans to equip her workforce through training on a number of important issues that affect their job. She once again reiterated calls for employees to at all time exercise a high level of professionalism as they go about interacting with auditees, something she said promotes the quality of employees in the Commission.

AFROSAI-E Completes Peer Review on Liberia's SAI

A team of auditors from AFROSAI-E has completed a peer review the General Auditing Commission (GAC). The Review exercise, according to the team, was intended to assist the Supreme Audit Institution (SAI) of Liberia to assess its quality control system against the AFROSAI-E Institutional Capacity Building Framework. The focus was on whether the SAI's Regularity Audits methods and procedures comply with international standards. The team also hoped to make relevant recommendations on how the quality of audits could be improved.
